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relational theory for clinical practice offers students and practitioners a conceptual framework for thinking relationally about social work with clients within a biological psychological and socio cultural framework integrating relational theory with the

principles of clinical practice and demonstrating how this can be applied to social work practice this book has been revised and updated to be suitable for students using plenty of case material to demonstrate the theory in action the new edition incorporates teaching points to aid readers in drawing out the practice principles developed in each chapter keeping relationships at the center of the text this edition includes substantially expanded chapters on assessment and intervention and takes into account recent research on issues such as the impact of trauma and stress neuroscience and brain research and the necessity of practicing in a culturally sensitive way with diverse populations it broadens the feminist focus of relational cultural theory by extending and applying it to men also designed for use on master s level courses in practice as well as courses on human behavior and the social environment this concise and practical book is a valuable text for social work and counseling students

this book brings together recent research developments in relating theory it is divided into four parts which introduce the reader to relating theory how it has developed and how it can be applied to clinical and forensic psychology topics include how couples relate to one another how young people relate to their parents how assessments of relating can be used in therapy how specific negative relating styles relate to offending behaviour risk taking and alcohol use psychopathic and sadistic tendencies and how the interpersonal relating of offenders can change during treatment in prison the book covers international research involving both quantitative and qualitative methods and will be of interest to clinicians academics and both undergraduate and postgraduate students in the fields of psychology clinical psychology forensic criminal psychology psychiatry psychotherapy counselling art therapy and mental health

when people seek psychological support formulation is the theory driven methodology used by many practitioners to guide identification of the processes mechanisms and patterns of behaviour that appear to be contributing to the presenting difficulties however the process of formulating or applying psychological theory to practice can often seem unclear in this volume we present multiple demonstrations of formulation in action written by applied psychologists embedded in clinical training research and practice the volume covers a range of contemporary approaches to formulation and therapy that have not been considered in extant works and includes unique sections offering critical counter perspectives and commentaries on each approach and its application by authors working from alternative theoretical positions

first published in 2002 to those who see freud solely as a psychologist and a psychotherapist it may be surprising to find him discussed as a major contributor to sociology in this book robert bocock argues that freud s work far from being exclusively concerned with individual personality seen in abstraction from the social and cultural environment does have important implications for social theory and is not always given the serious sociological study it deserves bocock demonstrates freud s central relevance to sociological discussions about gender sexuality the family religion ideology and symbolism political authority and language and examines the considerable influence that freud s theories have had upon sociological schools
